Brief Description of Program:

For summer 2018, we operated two half-day programs each spanning two 3-week sessions in the months of June and July.

- The Full Steam Ahead program targeted kids grades K-5. This program was held at the Gilbert Elementary School and consisted of group activities designed to educate and enrich across a variety of topics. This was our third year running this program.

- The S.T.E.A.M. Academy (short for "Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, & Math") program targeted adolescents grades 6-8. This brand new program was held at the Gilbert Middle School. We designed our own project-based curriculum incorporating topics ranging from cooking to stop-motion animation to building your own computer.

Clear Impact Score Card performance measures were selected for our program in the spring. Assessments in the form of survey questions were developed by our staff for both our participants at the elementary school and middle school levels. Questions were asked daily of each participant for each of the 6 weeks.

- % of youth that improved or maintained positive relationship skills
- % of youth who learned a new skill
